LEARNING SHOULD BE A LIFELONG ADVENTURE

We want every child at Starbeck Primary Academy to reach their potential and have the skills and knowledge they need to prepare them for the next stage of their education. Our aim is for every child to become an enthusiastic reader, a fluent writer and to be confident in their number skills.

Above all, we believe that school should be inspiring and learning should be exciting. We take education beyond the classroom to expose children to new environments. We encourage learning through real-life topics and experiences.

LEARNING AND SUCCEEDING

Starbeck Primary Academy is a good school, where the quality of teaching and learning has been found to be good by Ofsted.

Results from national tests show that our children make good progress during their time at Starbeck and that they achieve results broadly similar to those in other schools nationally. This is true regardless of our children's background or their starting points — pupils with special educational needs, for example, also make good progress.

We aim to provide a curriculum which both teaches skills and provides opportunities for children to apply those skills. In all lessons we:

- share the learning intention with the pupils so that they know what they are learning and why.
- 🦊 we ensure that questioning, variation and challenge are part of every lesson.
- differentiate activities so that children can work at the right level for them, whether this is with extra support or more challenge.
- 🦊 mark and evaluate the learning with the pupils by using the steps already shared.
- 🖊 give pupils opportunities to improve their work further.





Part of something bigger



Our journey to become an even better school is made easier by being part of a larger family of schools in the Northern Star Academies Trust. Our sister schools include outstanding academies across North Yorkshire, both primary and secondary.

Being part of a trust gives us additional opportunities as a small primary school. Our children can visit our trust schools to take advantage of specialist teaching facilities — for example in science. In addition, trust schools send their specialists (such as foreign language teachers) to Starbeck, adding breadth to our curriculum.

We also encourage students to help one another across the trust. Student mentors from the trust's secondary schools support our oldest children before they move to high school.

Being part of a trust means that Starbeck Primary Academy is stronger and more sustainable.
