LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

Please could I remind all parents and carers of the national regulations for requests of leave of absence during term time. The education regulations state that applications for leave must be made in advance by the parent or carer with whom the child lives and can only be authorised by the school in exceptional circumstances. Each application is considered individually by the school. Examples of 'exceptional circumstances' include:

- Service personnel returning from active deployment.
- Where inflexibility of parents' leave or working arrangement is part of the organisational or company policy (evidenced by written confirmation from the company).
- Where leave is recommended as part of a parents' or child's rehabilitation from medical or emotional problems. Evidence must be provided.
- When a family needs to spend time together to support each other during or after a crisis.

Please note: Headteachers would not be expected to class term time holidays as exceptional. Parents/carers must obtain the school's permission before making any arrangements, otherwise the absence will be recorded as unauthorised and a penalty notice/fine may be issued. If you do require an application form for leave or to discuss a specific request, please speak to our admin team via the school office. Applications should be completed at least 6 weeks in advance.

YEAR 3 KNARESBOROUGH WALKING TRIP

It was so nice to see the return of outdoor educational visits this half term. Year 3 went on an outing to the woods and riverside scenery of Knaresborough. This linked to their learning in History, Geography and Art with children creating wild artwork in the woodland on the way to Knaresborough, exploring the riverside for geographical features and creating maps and they even squeezed in time for an ice cream by the riverside.

NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS WEEK

By now you will I'm sure be aware that we are all about positive mental health and wellbeing at Starbeck Primary. This week is National Mental Health Awareness Week and the theme for this year's week is 'nature'. Recent National Trust research found a link between feeling connected to nature and having improved wellbeing.

Outdoor learning is rooted within our curriculum as well as a range of other extra-curricular activities such as our weekly 'Wellbeing Wednesdays' assemblies and our Curriculum Stars. As an example, our Reception class have completed one of their Starbeck Stars which is 'To look after a plant.' After germinating a bean seed at school, the class looked at the developing shoots and talked about what the

seedling would need to help it grow. They then took the bean plant home in a cup with a challenge to pot the bean into soil or compost and see if they could help it grow. The children are excited about their bean growth and have been sharing lots of positive photos and news about their success!
