SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

KS2 OUTCOMES

Our results for Reading, Writing & Maths, as well as the combined percentage (those achieving the expected standard in all 3 subjects), were all above or well above national averages. Food support over the summer holidays Resurrected Bites Community Groceries

A weekly shop from as little as £3

The community groceries are run through a subscription scheme and are for people who are in financial hardship. It costs just a fraction of a normal supermarket shop and it saves thousands of tonnes of food from going to landfill every week. You can join for £5 then have access to a weekly shop for just a few pounds (a 4+ family can get their shop for £6). They run at New Park School and Gracious Street Methodist Church in Knaresborough twice weekly https://resurrectedbites.co.uk/#groceries They also run pay as you feel cafes in Harrogate at West Park URC (Weds 10am-2pm), Killinghall Methodist Church (Thurs 11.30am-2pm) and at the Centre on Gracious Street in Knaresborough (Fri 10am-2pm) https://resurrectedbites.co.uk/#cafes

Harrogate & Knaresborough Toy Library

For a small annual membership fee, families can borrow up to 2 toys for up to 2 weeks at a time (but you are welcome to change your toys at any point within this period). They operate a click and collect service from their base in Knaresborough which usually runs on Wednesdays and Fridays, 10am - 11.30am plus 2 Saturdays of every month. Universal Credit – childcare payments

Universal Credit maximum childcare payments will rise from 28^{th} June. Parents will be able to claim back monthly on their childcare costs on UC up to £951 for one child and £1,630 for two or more children. Parents who enter work or significantly increase their work hours will also be able to get help with the upfront payment for their first childcare bill instead of having to pay the costs and then claim back https://helpforhouseholds.campaign.gov.uk/help-with-childcare-costs/?mc_cid=bfo7963fd6&mc_eid=f373e1c323

Cost of living payments

Cost of Living Payments – The first £301 for people who receive a means tested benefit was paid between 25th of April and 17th of May. The next payment is due in the Autumn. Disability cost of living payments -- £150 for households who receive benefits such as PIP, DLA and Attendance Allowance will be paid between 20^{th} June and 4^{th} July.

Energy Bills

From 1 July the average annual energy price will drop and the advice is to do a meter reading to ensure that you are being billed correctly. If you have a smart meter, always check the bill to make sure readings are going through correctly. Reminder that there **won't** be the £400 worth of government support for fuel bills this coming winter. Despite the price drop households will pay on average £137 more per year.
