ACADEMY IMPROVEMENT PLAN

We were very pleased with our summer term outcomes, where we have once again achieved above or well above national averages for the individual Reading, Writing and Maths KS2 SATs and our combined percentage of children achieving the expected standard in all 3 subjects. Once data has been validated nationally, we will share this with you. We have already begun work on the actions from this year's Academy Improvement Plan, which will be finalised with governors this week. Our primary focuses this year will be on further enhancing our established Maths Mastery approach in school, through participation in our local Maths Mastery Hub; continuing to enhance our curriculum offer across all non-core subject areas, via deep dives and related staff CPD; and further embedding the work from last year around early reading and phonics. We will keep you updated on specific developments during the school year.
