Dear Parents & Carers,

We have almost reached the end of term and I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support and kindness since our return in September. We expected that this would be a challenging term due to the tight restrictions and rules, however what has shone through is that with positive support from our families, children have shown resilience and fantastic motivation to be back in the classroom and learning.

As we move into the holiday period, it is vital that we all continue to take great care out and about and when mixing over Christmas, so that we can aim to return in January fit and well. We feel that our community's adherence to guidelines has helped to keep infection cases to a minimum. Although we have remote learning plans in place, we would much prefer to maintain school-based learning and the benefits this brings to children.

End of term confirmation

You may have seen in the news that the DfE offered schools the option of closing a day early and making Friday an INSET day. This was purely due to the government realising that, as school leaders must be contactable for 6 days after closing in the event of contact tracing needs, this would include Christmas Eve. The trade-off was also to move an INSET from later in the year. Our trust collectively decided that it was too short notice to be changing holiday dates, which creates extra pressure for parents on childcare and therefore our final day of term remains as **Friday 18**th **December**.
