Dear Parents & Carers,

We are rapidly approaching the Christmas holiday with only 2 further weeks to go after this one. We do still have a lot to fit in before then and we are doing our very best to make the education and learning for your children as smooth and uninterrupted as possible amidst the ongoing and ever-changing pandemic. Like all schools around us, we are experiencing positive cases of Covid-19 in a range of classes and we are grateful for your support with updates around testing and prompt notification when children are experiencing Covid symptoms.

#### **COVID-19 UPDATES**

This week, we have seen the reintroduction of face masks in various contexts. At school, staff are wearing masks in communal/shared areas of the school and all visitors and contractors must wear a face mask. If you are visiting the school office, could we once again kindly ask you to follow this guidance. Primary age children do not need to wear face masks unless they or parents wish to wear them. As before, should we notice that children have any of the main Covid-19 symptoms, they will be sent home and a PCR test should be taken. Although close contacts of a positive covid case are notified by the NHS, in line with our trust policy, parents and carers will continue to be updated by letter should there be a positive case in their class. We strongly advise in these cases, that you seek a PCR test for your child, irrespective of whether they are symptomatic or not. We have seen some positive cases in school where no symptoms were present. Thank you for your ongoing support with this.

#### CHILDREN IN NEED

Thank you to everyone that recently supported our Children in Need Day and for all your contributions. On the day, we raised a total of £365.00 which has already be sent off to the fantastic charity.
