## NEWSLETTER

Dear Parents & Carers,

We hope you have all had a good start to 2022 and wish you all the very best for the coming year. As always, our children have impressed us with the seamless way in which they have re-integrated to school following the Christmas and New Year break. We have lots more to achieve this school year and are hoping for a calming of the storm, in terms of the pandemic, to enable us to have a more 'normal' spring and summer term.

## LATEST GOVERNMENT ADVICE REGARDING COVID

As you will be fully aware, the situation around testing and isolation keeps changing. The main change since breaking up for the holiday was the opportunity to reduce the isolation period to 7 days. As this currently stands, anyone who tests positive for Covid-19 must isolate for 10 days. The isolation period is counted from the day **after** the positive test result or when symptoms began. This can only be reduced to 7 days if a negative Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test is taken and registered on day 6 and day 7. There must be a 24 hour gap between testing. If you test positive on day 6, then the 2 day negative test window moves to day 7 and 8. If you reach day 10 and still register a positive test, you do not need to continue to take LFD tests – as long as you are well, you can return to school/work. The key window for being infectious has passed.

DfE are currently recommending that LFD tests are not taken for 1 week after completing an isolation period.

You will have heard that the government has announced that the isolation period will change again on Monday. From Monday the isolation period can be reduced to 5 days however a negative test must be registered on day 5 and day 6 and your child must not have a temperature. This advice will be updated on Monday to reflect any further changes. If you have any questions, please contact our school office.

You will also have seen that if your child tests positive on a LFD test, you no longer need to confirm this with a PCR test. The main reason for pursuing a PCR test would be if your child has Covid symptoms and you have not already tested using a LFD test – you should therefore isolate immediately and order a PCR test via the NHS website.

## **PAN CONSULTATION**

We recently sent out details regarding n period of consultation in relation to the proposed change of our Pupil Admission Number (PAN) to 30 – reflecting our structure of a one form entry school. The consultation period is now complete and any responses that we received were supporting this change. This change was in relation to the 2023 entry year. Due to the popularity of the school and concern over over-sizing of our classes, we are now in discussions with the Department for Education to request an exceptional variation to our PAN for Reception entry 2022. Further information in relation to this can be found on our website and this does not affect any current classes, only future admissions to the Reception year.
